## State Testing:

Our testing schedule starts March 25, 2024 with the AzSci is for 5 th graders. We will be testing ELA, Writing and Math throughout the month of April for 3 rd – 5th graders.

It is very important that your child is at school on the days that their tests are scheduled. Here are some great test taking tips to help our students do their very best:

## Testing Tips for Parents:

- 1. Make sure your child gets plenty of rest the night before the test.
- 2. On the morning of the test, your child needs to get up in plenty of time, so he/she won't feel rushed and is at school on time 7:40 a.m.
- 3. Feed your child a good breakfast or bring your child to school early to eat breakfast here. Research shows that children do better on tests if they have had a good breakfast.
- 4. Do as much as you can to make your child feel comfortable. Try not to say things to make him/her feel more nervous.
- 5. Reassure your child that no matter the outcome of the test you will still love him/her. Encourage them to simply do their best.

This statewide assessment is a tool that helps us evaluate the academic progress of our students, ensuring they meet the required educational standards.

The purpose of the AASA is to measure students' understanding of key concepts and skills taught throughout the school year. It provides valuable insights into their academic strengths and areas that may require additional attention. Provide a Supportive Environment: Create a calm and supportive atmosphere at home during the testing period. Minimize distractions and offer encouragement without adding undue pressure.

• Celebrate Effort: Regardless of the results, acknowledge your child's efforts and hard work. Emphasize that learning is a continuous process, and the assessment is just one measure of their progress.
